During Japan colonies Japanese soldiers took the crops from Indonesia therefore Indonesian people couldn't eat rice at that time.

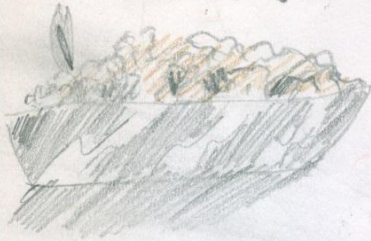
Then they decided to find substitute food to replace rice. They called it tiwul. It was made from cassava.
